

# What is the 10 Day Film Challenge?

- We are a high school film competition.
- In 2016: 24 states, 140 high schools, 400+ films, 4,500 students participated.
- Students have 10 school days to script, shoot, score and edit a 3-4 minute original film.
- They have a required character name, backstory, prop and line of dialogue that must appear in the film.
- They have a choice of genres.
- All work must be done on school time/grounds in 10 days.

# What is the 10 Day Film Challenge?



- Our mission is to 'level the playing field for all students.'
- Our competition is FREE for students and teachers.
- No submission fees.
- No theater / screening admission.
- As a NON-PROFIT, we hold fundraising events.
- We find corporate sponsors.
- We utilize local, state, and federal grants.


## Why should you be a judge?

- You have filmmaking experience and expertise.
- You have a youthful opinion.
- You have a thoughtful, educated opinion.
- You may fulfill a college 'service' requirement.
- We are a federally approved 501(c)(3) charitable organization.
- Judging may serve as volunteer hours.

### How do you judge films?

- All judging occurs online.
- All films are posted on YouTube for YOU.
- The scorecard is online for YOU.
- Watch alone or with fellow film students, but complete INDIVIDUAL scorecards.
- We need INDIVIDUAL SCORECARDS for each person. This is a MUST. You will ONLY get credit for a scorecard YOU complete.




# Step 2: See our rubric for the scoring guideline and point system

Step 3: Watch approximately 30 films. 3 – 4 minutes max per film.




## Step 4: Score each film using our online scorecard.



## When do you judge films?

- Judging occurs in the spring.
- Usually in late March, April, early May.
- You will choose one of our judging time windows that works for YOU.
- It will take about 3 hours total over 1 week time period.
- You can do it in segments at your leisure.
- You can binge watch & judge.
- We want YOU to have flexibility and convenience.

- Once registered, we will EMAIL you YOUR specific films and scorecard at judging time.

## Your impact as a judge

- Your scores will determine which films go to Statewide Screening and Awards Day at a Regal Cinema.
- Anywhere from 80 120 films are made per state
- Screening and Awards Day for the Top 30 films in a given state.
- Biggest event of the year for many students.
- "If filmmaking was a sport, the 10 Day Film Challenge is their Super Bowl"
- "It's the AP Exam of Filmmaking"
- Your scores will impact awards for student filmmakers.
- Valuable feedback for teachers and students to improve.
